<u>Source Separated Material</u>	<u>Disposition</u>
Paper Products: including newspaper (with inserts), magazines, office paper, junk mail, telephone and paperback books, corrugated cardboard and Kraft grocery bags. (Shredded junk mail & office paper also acceptable.	Curbside collection may be provided by the ACUA or by a municipality or a contracted hauler. Materials may be delivered to the ACUA for processing. For materials not delivered to the ACUA, the tonnage information for this material must be reported to the ACUA & the municipality of origin.
Clear & Colored Glass Bottles/Containers.	Curbside collection may be provided by the ACUA or by a municipality or a contracted hauler. Materials may be delivered to the ACUA for processing. For materials not delivered to the ACUA, the tonnage information for this material must be reported to the ACUA & the municipality of origin.
Food & Beverage metal containers including aluminum, bi-metal and steel food beverage and aerosol cans. Also included are empty paint cans.	Curbside collection may be provided by the ACUA or by a municipality or a contracted hauler. Materials may be delivered to the ACUA for processing. For materials not delivered to the ACUA, the tonnage information for this material must be reported to the ACUA & the municipality of origin.
Plastic Bottles and Jugs imprinted with a "1" (PETE) or "2" (HDPE) on the bottom including food, beverage, health/beauty, and cleaning products, bottles 2 ½ gallons or less in size. Automotive fluid containers and other bottles which contain hazardous products are <u>not</u> included.	Curbside collection may be provided by the ACUA or by a municipality or a contracted hauler. Materials may be delivered to the ACUA for processing. For materials not delivered to the ACUA, the tonnage information for this material must be reported to the ACUA & the municipality of origin.
Leaves	May be delivered to the ACUA yard waste composting facility at a nominal fee set by ACUA to cover operational costs. Alternately, delivered to an approved municipal or agricultural yard waste composting facility or used in backyard composting. All tonnage and/or volume information must be reported to the municipality of origin.
Grass clippings	Same as above. "Cut it & leave it" or backyard composting is the preferred method for disposal.
Brush, tree branches, tree stumps, and Christmas trees including vegetative and land clearing waste.	Same as above.

ATLANTIC COUNTY LIST OF DESIGNATED RECYCLABLES

<u>Source Separated Material</u>	<u>Disposition</u>
“White Goods”, ferrous scrap, and non-ferrous scrap includes refrigerators, air conditioners, other “CFC” containing appliances, and washers, dryers, ovens, water heaters, steel and metal piping.	May be delivered to ACUA and/or a private scrap metal facility. It is the responsibility of the accepting facility to report tonnage information back to the municipality of origin.
Asphalt & Concrete	May be Delivered to an approved NJDEP recycling center as “Class B” materials. Accepting facility is responsible for reporting tonnage to municipality of origin.
Contaminated Soil including fuel contaminated soil, dewatered soil and stone subject to NJDEP regulatory standards.	Delivered to ACUA landfill at a reduced rate depending on an as-needed basis and when in compliance with ACUA acceptance procedures.
Propane Tanks (must be empty 20 lbs. size or less)	Delivered to ACUA Transfer Station at a nominal charge to offset costs or to a private sector recycling facility.
Cooking Grease (from commercial sources only)	Private recyclers.
Consumer Electronics (a.k.a. E-Waste) including: CPU’s, monitors, keyboards, mouse, TV’s, VCR’s, radios, telephones.	Delivered to municipal collection program or to charity donation center or to a national chain store with a collection program.
Auto and Truck Bodies	Private sector markets/junk yards.
Tires: commercial and passenger vehicles tires	Delivered to ACUA Transfer Station/MRF for recycling or to a private sector recycling facility. Fee is charged to cover operational costs.
Used Motor Oil, Kerosene, and #2 home heating oil including crankcase oil and other oils which meet market specifications.	Delivered to ACUA during scheduled household hazardous waste collection events from residential sources. Commercial & Institutional sources must use private sector recyclers.
Anti-freeze	Delivered to ACUA during scheduled household hazardous waste collection events from residential sources. Commercial & Institutional sources must use private sector recyclers.
Lead acid batteries including motor vehicle, aviation, marine, and sealed lead acid (SLA) batteries.	Delivered to ACUA during scheduled household hazardous waste collection events or to private sector recycling facilities.
Consumer Rechargeable Batteries	All rechargeable batteries can be delivered to ACUA during scheduled household hazardous waste collection events. Commercial & Institutional sources may local recyclers.
